From Father Jacob

There was a rich man who dressed in purple garments and fine linen and dined sumptuously each day. And lying at his door was a poor man named Lazarus, covered with sores, who would gladly have eaten his fill of the scraps that fell from the rich man's table.

Our Gospel story today is a very famous one of the rich man and Lazarus. I think it is sufficiently clear on its own, so I won't belabor it with a long explanation. Cardinal George, the past Archbishop of Chicago, once put a fine point on it when he addressed a visiting group of wealthy donors: "The poor need you to draw them out of poverty, and you need the poor to keep you out of Hell."

People today sometimes console themselves that while the rich man in the parable ignored the poor man who was at his door, they don't have any poor people at their door-they don't see them in their neighborhood or at their work. I don't think we should be comforted by this. Ever since the Second World War we have built in this country a very efficient system to shield the rich from the poor and keep them from having to have uncomfortable interactions with poor people. Rich people generally get very uncomfortable when this system breaks down, and people will go to great lengths to preserve this system: just observe any city council meeting or planning meeting where people talk about "property values" or "the character of the neighborhood". Keeping the poor at arm's length might be more comfortable in this life, but I don't think it will make much difference at the judgement when we will see the poor and their needs very clearly none-the-less. May we not avoid seeing them here and now.

Our Parish's Generosity

I have been amazed by our parish's generosity in supporting good causes in our community and around the world. Just this week our parish contributed about \$970 to the Knights of Columbus to support their work with those with intellectual disabilities and gave \$1,107 to support food aid in Gaza. Thank you for your generosity!

Parish Mission

What a wonderful parish mission we had with the Marian Sisters! About 90 people from all three parishes gathered last weekend to pray together, learn from the sisters, and enjoy good food and fellowship. It was beautiful to hear the sisters' testimonies on prayer and the Christian life, and to put their witness into practical use through beautiful prayer time both Friday night and Saturday morning. A special thank you to the Knights of Columbus who helped with both meals, and to Heather and the religious education committee, who helped plan and coordinate the retreat!

Retaining wall work

In the next few weeks you will see extensive construction work on the retaining wall in front of the rectory. We are going to demolish and rebuild this wall at a higher level. We are doing this work for a few reasons:

The current wall is crumbling in several places and tilting (just a bit so far, but more each year) in other places. It needs to be rebuilt.

The wall is low, and the steep slope means we can't use much of our parish's "front yard". By rebuilding it higher we will gain a small amount of useable space.

Our new retaining wall will fix both the more urgent (crumbling wall) and less urgent (useable space) issues. It should be finished yet this fall.

As you can imagine, a project like this is expensive. It will cost us about \$40,000 to demolish the old wall and build the new one. We are able to undertake this project without doing a capital campaign because of the generosity of past generations of St Peter's Parishioners, who have left us an endowment for our parish that continue to help us keep up our buildings and grounds. Please consider remembering St Peter's in your will and continuing this great legacy.


